Instructions

You will need: one set of sentences per group

- Explain to students that you are going to give them some topics, and they must talk about them by either telling the truth, or by lying. Other students must guess whether they are lying or not.
- Divide students into groups of three or four, depending on how big your class is.
- Give each group a set of sentences face down in the middle of the group. Students take turns to take a sentence, show it to the group, and talk about it. They can either lie or tell the truth. Other students in the group listen and ask follow up questions, then decide if the student is telling the truth or lying.
- Monitor and make notes on students' language use for later feedback with the class.
